St. Mary Mass Intention Policies

The practice of requesting a Mass to be offered for a deceased loved one is a beautiful and wonderful part of our Catholic tradition. In our parish, there are many requests for scheduling such Mass intentions. As a way to allow as many parishioners and friends as possible to schedule Mass intentions, the following policies are put forth to help make the process easy and fair to all.

1. The date that the books open for scheduling Mass intentions will be published in the bulletin. Mass intentions will be scheduled on a first come, first served basis
2. Beginning **immediately**, we will schedule no more than 10 intentions per household; only two of the ten may be for Sunday (Saturday evening) Masses. If a household's limit has been reached, new requests may only be made for newly deceased loved ones.
3. A \$10 stipend, as determined by Diocesan policy, is to accompany each Mass intention request.
4. Mass intentions will NOT be scheduled for Christmas, Holy Week or Easter Sunday Masses. The intention for these Masses will be for the deceased members of the parish or the specific intentions of the priest.
5. Church law requires only one intention per Mass. However, we will permit: one intention with up to 3 first names with the same last name (i.e. John, Paul and Mary Smith) or one intention with two last names only (i.e. the Jones and Smith Families).
6. **Mass intentions can be scheduled with Lisa Meyers in the Parish office Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays, from 9:00 a.m. to Noon** If you are unable to schedule in person, you can call or email Lisa 608-868-3335; lisa.meyers.sm@gmail.com. She will return your communication in a timely manner with Mass times as close to your chosen date as possible.

- ✦ Thanks to Amy Volciak for organizing the Teen Night at St. Joseph on April 9-10. It was faith enriching and fun!

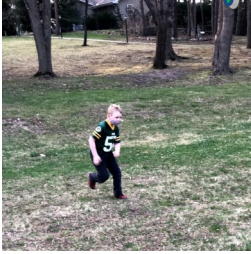

ST. JOSEPH FINANCIAL UPDATE: April 18, 2021

It has been just over a year since the beginning of the pandemic and quarantine, and 5 months since we introduced the Offertory Program. With the uncertainty of the past year, we would like to give you an update on the finances of our parish. We are happy to report the Offertory Program has been effective. Both the envelope collection and the contributions to the offertory via the Giving Portal have increased significantly from a year ago.

- The average monthly contributions by parishioners have increased to \$17,000 from \$14,000
- Contributions using the Other Capital Expenditures envelopes are \$3,322 from \$1,999 (up 66%)
- Prior to November 2020 there were 10 parishioners/families utilized the Recurring Gift option contributing \$1,268/month; as of March 31, 2021, there are 26 parishioners/families contributing \$3,438/month

Financial summary comparison for this fiscal year-to-date vs. the prior fiscal year-to-date:

Our investments account has done very well over the last year with a gain of just over \$120,000.

We were able to secure a Payroll Protection Program Loan of \$19,460 which has been forgiven.

Overall, we are in an improved financial position over the previous fiscal year despite the pandemic. However, even with the increase in average monthly offertory, the break-even amount required is \$18,000/month without relying on additional fundraising. That does not include extraordinary maintenance, repairs or upgrades to the church that are supported through the Other Capital Expenditures fund. Some of the immediate needs are as follows:

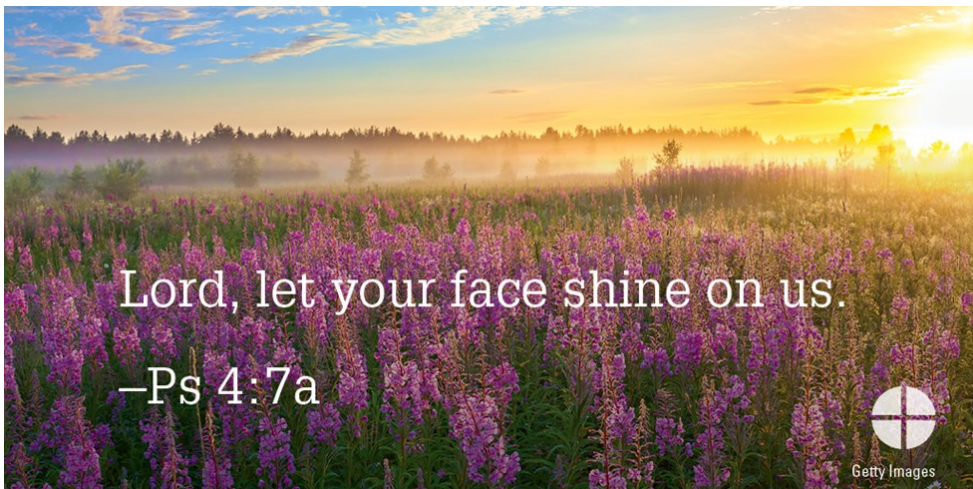

This year the funds raised will be put towards carpeting the remaining five classrooms that either have no carpet or needs to be replaced: estimated cost of \$13,500.

We would like to extend our sincere appreciation for the wonderful response and all your financial support by Mail, In-Person, or the Giving Portal. Your generosity, both monetarily and by offering your time and talent is the cornerstone to the stability and success of our parish.
