CORPUS CHRISTI PROCESSION IN JANESVILLE - June 6 at 3:00 p.m. All are invited to a Corpus Christi procession through downtown Janesville. The event begins at 3:00 p.m. with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament on the steps of Nativity of Mary Church, 313 E. Wall St. Participants will slowly walk the less-than-a-mile path to St. Patrick Church, 315 Cherry St. While walking, we will sing and pray the Rosary. The procession ends with Benediction at an outdoor altar in the St. Patrick Church parking lot. Procession participants are encouraged to park in the St. Patrick School parking lot (where the procession will end) and then be shuttled by bus to Nativity of Mary Church for the start of the event. Benediction and tailgate with food, music, and games to follow at St. Patrick Church parking lot. Grilled meats provided - bring your own lawn chairs, snacks, beverages, and games. 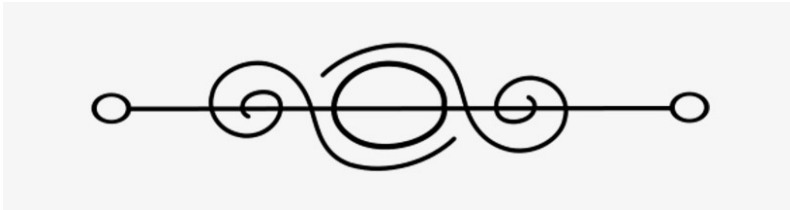


A Note from Our Pastor ...

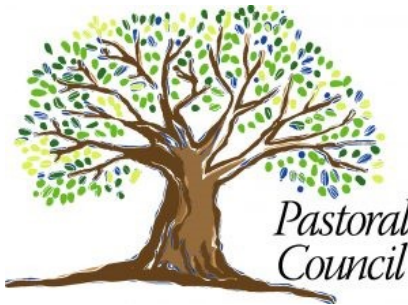
PASTORAL COUNCIL AND TRUSTEE ELECTIONS - St. Mary, Milton:

Each year the congregation is invited to nominate parishioners for the three soon-to-be vacant positions on our Pastoral Council and one soon-to-be-vacant position of Parish Trustee. Pastoral Council members are elected for a term of 3 years and Trustees are elected for a term of 2 years.

Because of the pandemic last year, it was determined not to hold an election. The Council and Trustee members whose terms were expiring, agreed to serve for an extra year. Because of this, our election will look a little different this year.

Our ballot will include replacing three members whose term will end in **two years** instead of three, and three additional members whose term will end in **three years**. The Trustee ballot will include electing one member for a **one year term**, and electing another member for **two years**.

The nomination process will begin with paper forms being distributed before Mass this weekend. The deadline for submitting nominations is Sunday, May 30.



Then each nominee will be invited to attend a special prayer service in church to obtain additional information and discern if having their name on the ballot is their calling at this time.

Elections for Pastoral Council and Trustee at St. Mary will take place the weekend of June 19 & 20. If you have any questions, please contact Vicki at 449-6530.

Pastoral Council Member

The Council assists and advises the pastor in his decisions concerning matters of the parish and participates in parish planning based upon the inputs of the parishioners and needs of the parish.

Secretary Trustee

The Secretary Trustee serves on behalf of the parishioners, as an advisor and counselor to the Pastor and consultative bodies of the parish. Serves as a member of the parish corporate board. Responsible to ensure that the parish maintains accurate and detailed non-financial parish corporation records.

Are You Feeling Called?

The overall responsibility for our parish lies with all of us, not just the priest and staff. We ask you to please join us in this journey by discerning whether you feel called to serve on Pastoral Council or as the Secretary Trustee.
