The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

“And Mary said, ‘My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord; my spirit rejoices in God my savior.’”

Luke 1:46

It is essential that the sick under care do not feel themselves to be a burden, but can sense the intimacy and support of their loved ones” (SB 4-5).

A Note from Our Pastor ...



- ✠ Our evangelization coordinator at both parishes, Jim Salimes, has stepped down from his position as his work situation has changed. I am grateful to Jim for coordinating with Evangelical Catholic and training a community of “disciple makers” during his year with us. Thank you, Jim! I hope to find a new evangelization coordinator.

- ✠ At St. Mary, please join me for a 5-minute tour after Mass to see some of the problems with our current building. We hope to begin building a new parish center next spring.

- ✠ Last week we started chanting the dialogue at the start of the Eucharistic Prayer. Please find the musical notes at the top of page 12 in the missalette.

- ✠ Here are my notes on “worship” from the 3rd week of the “Bread of Life” Discourse.
 - ⇒ It is human nature to worship someone or something. Then let us worship God!
 - ⇒ There are relatively many people who worship a creator, but fewer who worship a redeemer. Christians worship both: the Father is the Creator, and the Son is the Redeemer. In addition, we worship the Holy Spirit.
 - ⇒ In Revelation chapters 4 and 5, the heavenly multitudes worship the Father at first, but when Jesus the Lamb is revealed, they worship him, too. Similarly, in the Mass, when Jesus is revealed on the altar, we worship him along with the Father.

Elementary (Grades Kdg.—6)

Option 1: Weekly Classes (begin September 21/22)

Tuesday 4:00 - 5:00 p.m. or 6:00 - 7:00 p.m.

Wednesday 4:00 - 5:00 p.m. or 6:00 - 7:00 p.m.



Our Tuesday/Wednesday Elementary programs provide catechesis (Catholic studies) for children in grades Kindergarten - 6. The four areas of study are Explore Being Catholic, Faith-Filled People, Time with God, and Sharing God's Story. We have not been able to secure transportation for the early classes, so we have the later class at 6:00 p.m. again this year providing families with four class options.



Option 2: Once-A-Month Family Faith Class (begins September 19)

1st Sunday of the month from 9:30 - 11:30 a.m.

Family Faith takes place after the 8:30 a.m. Mass once a month. Parents and their children study the Faith together. The session includes breakfast, fellowship, prayer, saints, Church Traditions, Scripture, games, family projects, and more!

Sacrament Prep: Reconciliation & First Communion

Formal preparation for the Sacraments of Reconciliation and First Communion (that means you get the special workbooks) occurs in 2nd grade. A parent meeting will be held in October with details and the presentation of the family curriculum.



Youth Ministry (Grades 7-10)

2nd Sunday of the month from 9:30—11:30 a.m. or 5:30—7:30 p.m.
(begins September 26)

Youth Ministry includes youth in grades 7-10 who are preparing to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. Gatherings include Scripture, Catholic Tradition, Saints, Prayer, fellowship, and Apostolic Actions

(service).

Confirmation

Candidates choose their sponsor and saint name in their sophomore year. St. Mary provides a group Confirmation retreat. The bishop's office will notify the parish of the Confirmation celebration date.

During July's Pastoral Council

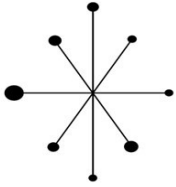
