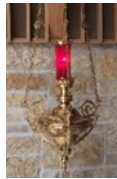

- ✚ I am hosting my priest support group tomorrow (Monday). The members are Fr. Mick Moon (recently retired, was at Belleville-Albany), Fr. Steve Brunner (McFarland), and Fr. Randy Budnar (Stoughton). We take time for socializing and discussion of church-related topics.

- ✚ I am excited that Bishop Hying will be celebrating Mass with our parishes on Saturday, Nov 13. He will be at St. Mary starting at 3:00 to meet with anyone before 4:00 Mass, and he will stay at St. Joseph for a reception after 5:45 Mass. It will be great for all of us to be together!

- ✚ Next weekend, Aug 28-29, I invite all St. Mary members to stay after 4:00 Mass and 8:30 Mass for a 15-minute presentation by committee members about our hopeful building project for next spring. There will be time for Q+A after that. In the following week you will all be invited to complete an online survey where you can share your thoughts about the project. Please come to the presentation and also complete the online questionnaire.

- ✚ Here are my notes from the fourth week that I talked about worship.
 - ⇒ Worship is life giving, and in the liturgy we become a sign and a witness to God's life in us.
 - ⇒ In the Eucharistic Prayer, it is Christ who presides, and we can imagine him offering himself at the Last Supper or on the Cross.
 - ⇒ In the Great Amen, we give our assent or agreement to the entire Eucharistic Prayer. We can be filled with gratitude, wonder, and praise toward the Father as we sing it.
 - ⇒ When we receive Communion, we are the closest that we can be to Jesus in this earthly life. We have time for very personal and intimate prayer while we are also united with the whole Church.

Elementary (Grades Kdg.—6)

Option 1: Weekly Classes (begin September 21/22)

Tuesday 4:00 - 5:00 p.m. or 6:00 - 7:00 p.m.

Wednesday 4:00 - 5:00 p.m. or 6:00 - 7:00 p.m.



Our Tuesday/Wednesday Elementary programs provide catechesis (Catholic studies) for children in grades Kindergarten - 6. The four areas of study are Explore Being Catholic, Faith-Filled People, Time with God, and Sharing God's Story. We have not been able to secure transportation for the early classes, so we have the later class at 6:00 p.m. again this year providing families with four class options.

Option 2: Once-A-Month Family Faith Class (begins September 19)

1st Sunday of the month from 9:30 - 11:30 a.m.

Family Faith takes place after the 8:30 a.m. Mass once a month. Parents and their children study the Faith together. The session includes breakfast, fellowship, prayer, saints, Church Traditions, Scripture, games, family projects, and more!

Sacrament Prep: Reconciliation & First Communion

Formal preparation for the Sacraments of Reconciliation and First Communion (that means you get the special workbooks) occurs in 2nd grade. A parent meeting will be held in October with details and the presentation of the family curriculum.



Youth Ministry (Grades 7-10)

2nd Sunday of the month from 9:30—11:30 a.m. or 5:30—7:30 p.m. (begins September 26)

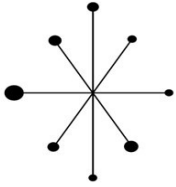

Confirmation

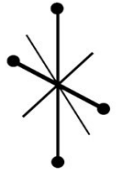
