REMINDERS ON MARRIAGE:

- The Church teaches that we are to live chastely if we are to live in a way pleasing to God and receive Communion.
- Catholics are urged to marry in the Church. The Church and its members want to celebrate with couples and offer support.
- Catholics must marry in the Church if they'd like to continue receiving Communion and be eligible as a sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation.
- Catholics who have married outside the Church are encouraged to seek a convalidation of their marriage, so they can receive Communion and be valid sponsors.
- Those previously married, even non-Catholics, may need to apply

for an annulment and get a positive decision before they can marry in the Church.

- Please meet with a priest to discuss any marriage-related questions.

A Note from Our Pastor ...



- ✚ I invite everyone in our parishes to complete the Disciple Maker Index (DMI) survey. Bishop Hying has asked every parish in the diocese to participate during October 14-November 22. It is a 15-minute survey that will ask for your thoughts and practices regarding discipleship. It is confidential, and in January we will get aggregate results for the whole parish. There is a link on both parish websites. Please try to use the internet, but we have paper copies at both churches.
- ✚ A year ago, under the leadership of Bishop Hying, our diocese started Phase I of the *Go Make Disciples* evangelization initiative. Phase I involves all parish leaders (staff, councils). Phase II starts next month, and it will involve all active parish members. Our evangelization team is currently making plans to involve all of us in Phase II. A year from now, Phase III, the last phase, will begin, and we will make a plan to evangelize everyone (yes, everyone) in our communities.
- ✚ Bishop Hying will come to both of our Masses on Saturday, November 13. He will arrive at St. Mary at 3:00 to talk with anyone before 4:00 Mass. He will stay after 5:45 Mass at St. Joseph to talk with anyone.
- ✚ We have an updated estimate of \$5.0 to 5.5 million for the new building project at St. Mary. The committee is seeking an estimate from another building contractor for comparison. We hope to have it in several weeks.
