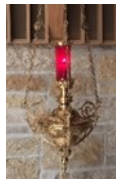

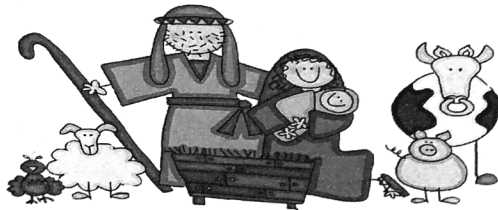

- ✠ The Men of Christ Conference will be at St. Cecilia Church in Wisconsin Dells on Saturday, November 13, 8:00 a.m. -4:00 p.m. Registration is \$40, student \$20 at Menofchristmadison.com/conference-2021/
- ✠ The State Department has contracted with the US Catholic Church to help resettle Afghan refugees. The Catholic Charities (CC) offices in all five dioceses of Wisconsin are involved, with the LaCrosse office leading (Fort McCoy is located there). The response throughout Wisconsin and the US has been very good with clothes, supplies, and toys. CC-LaCrosse says that the most helpful donation is cash. The next helpful act would be to contribute to the wish list at Target, Amazon, or Walmart using the CC-LaCrosse website, cclse.org (Afghan Refugee Assistance). They currently have enough volunteers. You can donate cash at the Madison Diocese website, madisondiocese.org. The effort will likely continue 12-24 months, and there is a concern of donation and volunteer fatigue, especially in the winter.
