KC SILVER ROSE COMING TO ST. MARY, MILTON: Save the date for Sunday, August 7 when a prayer service will be conducted immediately following Mass to honor the Silver Rose. The Silver Rose will then move to St. Joseph, Edgerton. *In 1960 a youth organization of the Knights of Columbus wanted to give something back to Our Lady of Guadalupe. They came up with the idea of running a rose to the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Monterrey, Mexico. The rose was chosen to commemorate Juan Diego and the*



miracle of the roses, an important part of the story of Our Lady of Guadalupe. The first rose was a natural rose and was blessed by the Bishop of London. It was then flown to New York and then shepherded to Dallas, Texas. After several more stops, it was finally brought back to Mexico. But after a year, the first rose had decomposed. Today, eight silver roses run along different North American routes that include Canada and every U.S. State, Puerto Rico, District of Columbia and Mexico.

RECLAIM SUNDAY



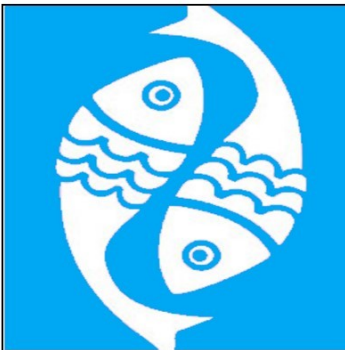
A day to attend Mass, to rest and spend time with family & friends

PERSONAL PRAYER



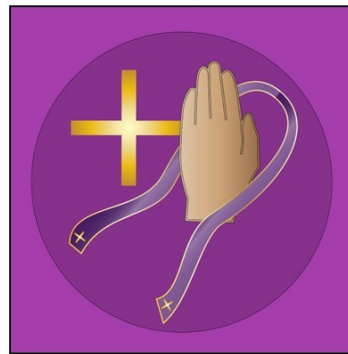
Spend at least 15 minutes per day in personal prayer

A Note from Our Pastor ...



✠ As we approach the midpoint of summer, I hope all of us will be blessed with times of summer refreshment and renewal. Simply being outside without wearing a jacket is exhilarating for me—I love it! Please also give some attention to incorporating the *four holy habits* into your routines. If anyone doesn't have a Bible, please take one from the stacks at either of our two churches. There are many good versions of the Bible, but I especially recommend the New American Bible (NAB or NABRE, revised edition).

As a diocese, we have engaged in Go Make Disciples, our evangelizing initiative, since Pentecost of 2020. This movement is not a three-year plan or a temporary project, but rather, our ongoing effort to live out the mission of the Church—to lead everyone into a deep, fruitful, and saving relationship with the Lord.

I asked each pastor to form an evangelization team in 2020 and begin meeting regularly to pray together, share their personal faith stories... Particular focus on the primacy of Sunday Mass, daily personal prayer, monthly confession, and Friday penance as four holy habits gave some consistent and practical form to this effort.
