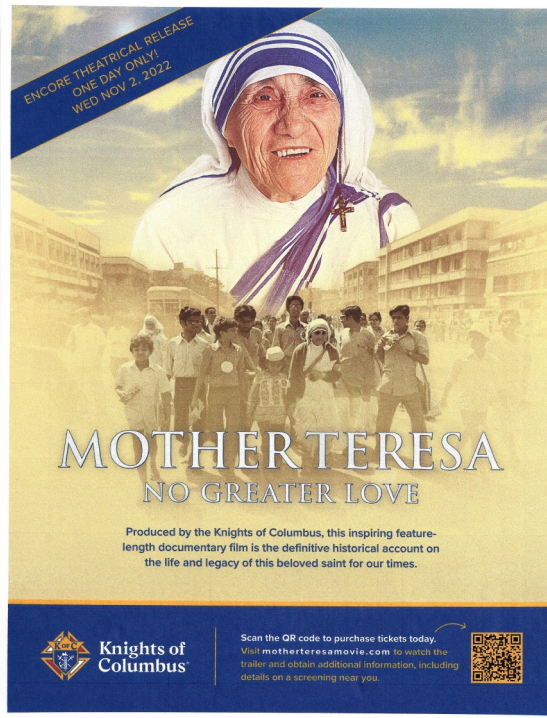



St. Mary Faith Formation

What a joy to have classes at St. Mary again!!

Family Ministry and the Tuesday/Wednesday (T/W) Elementary classes are all using the same curriculum this year. This month includes the topics: Liturgical Calendar, Stewardship, Prayer, and the Feast of All Souls.

Fr. David on *Into the Deep*

The diocese, which currently has 135 churches, will be divided into 30 pastorates, which are clusters of churches. Each pastorate will be led by a single pastor with one or more priests helping him. The pastorates will begin operating in July. Within a year after July the churches in the cluster will merge into a single parish with multiple worship sites (St. Joseph and St. Mary will be among those sites, but we don't know whether they will be in the same pastorate). At that time the cluster will no longer be called a "pastorate" but a "parish."

The reason for this structural change is not because of a shortage of priests (the number of priests is expected to remain stable in the next 10 years). Rather, it is because we have not been effective in fulfilling our mission, which is to make disciples. This is affirmed by the 8 takeaways of the current reality report. This ineffectiveness has become serious enough that we are led to make the structural changes.

Our intention is that the new structure or "realignment" will be better for making disciples than the old one. I encourage all of us to grow in awareness of, support of, and engagement in our mission, which is to evangelize and to make disciples. *We want to move from maintenance to mission.* Maintenance is continuing to do things the way we've always done them. Mission is doing things in a new way intentionally to fulfill the mandate Jesus gave us before he ascended into heaven, which is to "go make disciples" (Matthew 28:19). We want everything we do as a parish to help fulfill this mission. Making the transition will require prayers to God from all of us.

>> Sacramental Trends

Significantly fewer people are receiving the sacraments of the Catholic Church. In our Diocese we have more funerals than baptisms. 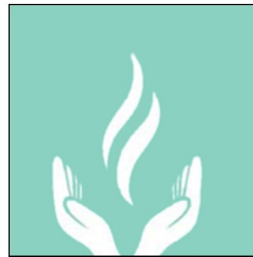

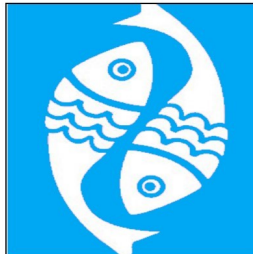
A day to attend Mass, to rest and spend time with family & friends

PERSONAL PRAYER



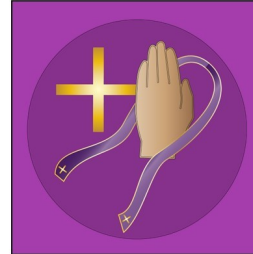
Pray and read the scriptures at least 15 minutes per day
