

does not record one spoken verse by him. Yet, St. Matthew identifies Joseph was "an upright man." He fulfilled his obligations courageously. Throughout the gospel he faithfully and unquestioningly obeved the commands of God, accepting the responsibility of his vocation-being a faithful spouse and father. To provide for his family, St. Joseph worked as a carpenter. As a good Jewish father, he passed this trade onto his Son, and "the indeed Iesus is known as carpenter's son" (Matthew 13:55). "He was chosen by the eternal Father as trustworthy guardian the and protector of His greatest treasures, namely, His divine Son and Mary, Joseph's wife. He carried out this vocation with complete fidelity until at last God called him" (St. Bernardine of Siena). Tradition holds that he died in the presence of Iesus and Mary. For this reason, St. Joseph is the patron saint of a holy death. He is exalted by the Church as, next to Mary herself, the greatest of all the saints and even Patron of the Universal Church.


The trees will be harvested, and the specialty items will be made during the week prior to delivery, so they will be very fresh.







Fr. David on Into the Deep

Last week I summarized the recently published Current Reality Report (all documents are at intothedeepmadison.org), which indicate that many measures of Catholic practices in our diocese are declining or trending in unsustainable ways. Please read Bishop Hying's unusually candid article on page 3 of last week's September 29 edition of the Catholic Herald. Here are a few excerpts. "We cannot do things the way they have always been done. That is not working...Too much of [our priests'] time is spent on administration...We have remarkable lay leaders, often underpaid and overworked...When I celebrate Mass in various parishes, the majority of the congregation is elderly...If we realign our resources without continuing to focus on the mission of evangelization, we are simply rearranging the furniture."

The realignment plan is now being developed and should be revealed sometime this fall. I am optimistic, because I know that the Holy Spirit has a plan to prosper us. It will require all of us at St. Joseph and St. Mary (not just some of us) to refocus on the mission of evangelization. Let us respond together!
