Catholic Churches: Since Vatican II, church buildings have taken new shapes. They are turned out in the rectangular, square and even in the round. The older churches were mostly rectangular. This set the altar on one of the shorter walls. When you entered the church you would then be facing the altar. On the wall above the altar was where the crucifix was hung. Depending on the time of day, beams of light would shine through the stained glass and rest on the cross or the altar itself. Many changes were made after Vatican II. Before Vatican II, our priests said Mass facing the altar, after Vatican II, they now face the congregation. Our churches have been through some changes over the years, but the one thing that will not change is that it is God's home, and He will always welcome us.

A Note from Our Pastor ...

Rejoice! Today is Gaudete Sunday, using a Latin word meaning "rejoice," because our salvation is nearer. Sometimes the decorations and vestments are a different color (the Church calls it "rose" color) from the usual purple on this day.



- Prepare Ye the Way of the Lord! The Advent Reconciliation (Confession) liturgy, for members of both parishes, is at St. Joseph-Edgerton on Wednesday, December 14 at 6:00 p.m.. I hope you can come. There will be five priests to hear confessions. I also hear confessions every week year-round at both churches.
- I hope you enjoyed the short time of silence at the end of Masses last weekend, during Eucharistic Adoration. Keep in mind that we have 3 hours of silent Adoration every 1st Tuesday night at St. Joseph and every 1st Thursday night at St. Mary.
- Share your 3-minute faith story--practice makes us ready to share it anytime, anywhere. Participants will gather immediately after Masses January 14-15 in groups of three to speak and listen. It should take ten minutes in total. See suggestions on story preparation below.

Preparing a Three-Minute Faith Story

- 1. Pray, asking for God's help.
- 2. Make a list of defining moments in your faith life or relationship with God (high points, low points, influential relationships, felt God's presence or absence, seasons of growth or discovery).
- 3. Select a few moments that show God's work and love that you would be willing to share with others, and develop them into a story.
- 4. You may identify some difficult moments that you would not want to share (disappointments, memories of hurt feelings). You may wish to bring those memories to your personal prayer, a trusted friend, or a spiritual advisor.
- 5. Try to use the name "God" or "Jesus" at least once in your story.
- 6. Practice and time your story to try to keep it to three minutes.

Each of us is called to be holy. Here are four habits that Bishop Hying has identified that will guide you on your path to holiness.

SUNDAY EUCHARIST



Reclaim the Sunday Eucharist as the center of parish life

FAST ON FRIDAY



Fast from meat or spend the day with some type of penance/mortification

PERSONAL PRAYER



Spend at least 15 minutes per day in personal prayer



Receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation monthly
