Matthew 5:3

Being detached from earthly things (power, money, and comfort) and being attached to heavenly things (charity, sacrifice, and mercy). Denying ourselves from satisfying our desires and helping others obtain their basic needs.

A Note from Our Pastor ...

- ✠ Today, in Matthew's Gospel, we begin Jesus' Sermon on the Mount, his most well-known teaching, and we continue in that sermon until Lent begins. It is a very challenging teaching, and the Franciscans especially are known for seeking to live it closely. It begins with the beatitudes, and I have noticed that of all the pilgrimage sites in the Holy Land, the Mount of the Beatitudes, where Jesus spoke these words, is where people are most reflective.
- ✠ We will be changing the Saturday Mass times on March 4, when St. Mary will host the early Mass, and St. Joseph will host the later one. We change every 6 months.
- ✠ The Eucharistic Congress for the Madison Diocese is coming! We are all invited to St. John the Baptist in Waunakee Sept 29-Oct 1. The congress centers on the Eucharist, the "sacrament of sacraments," the source and summit of our Christian faith. There will be national-level speakers and many opportunities to grow in relationship with the Lord. I hope that many of us can attend at least part of it.
- ✠ Please review the spring small group opportunities printed in this bulletin. Consider joining a group—it would be a great activity for Lent and/or Easter.

SUNDAY EUCHARIST



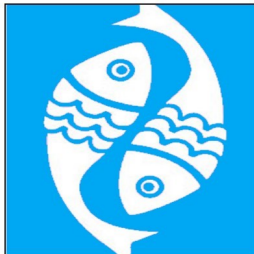
Reclaim the Sunday Eucharist as the center of parish life

PERSONAL PRAYER



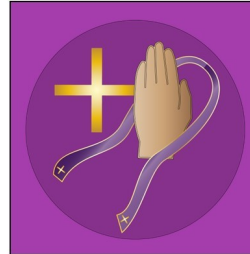
Pray and read the scriptures at least 15 minutes per day

FAST ON FRIDAY



Fast from meat or spend the day with some type of penance/mortification

CONFESSION



Receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation monthly
