





The Thresholds of Conversion

- 1. **Trust** No longer distrustful of Christianity or the Church
- 2. Curiosity Interested, may start asking questions about Christianity
- 3. **Openness** Open to change, no longer closed, it gets personal, start examining one's own life
- 4. **Seeking** Actively seeking, they may investigate everything—Jesus and also the alternatives to him
- 5. **Disciple** Make a personal and conscious decision to give one's entire life to God through Jesus

Our Parish's Path To Discipleship: small groups, and...

Our parishes must try to help people, including non-church-goers, progress to higher thresholds of conversion, all the way to "disciple." This happens when the Holy Spirit changes hearts, often using the words of sacred scripture. Our primary instrument now is <u>small groups</u>, but in time we hope to add others.

What about the Mass? Although God certainly can move people to higher thresholds through the weekend Mass (especially with well-done music, preaching, and welcoming people), other evangelizing tools seem to be more helpful. The Mass is really meant for "insiders," the initiated. For them, it is the closest experience of heaven on earth, but those not familiar with the Mass can feel left out, since they often don't know what is happening.

Four Holy Habits

Each of us is called to be holy. Here are four habits that Bishop Hying has identified that will guide you on your path to holiness.

SUNDAY EUCHARIST PERSONAL PRAYER



Reclaim the Sunday Eucharist as the center of parish life



Pray and read the scriptures at least 15 minutes per day

FAST ON FRIDAY



Fast from meat or spend the day with some type of penance/mortification

CONFESSION



Receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation monthly
