Here within Faith Formation, our team of Catechists serve at witnesses to God's love and share their own faith with those in their room. Standing in the hall, you hear the children learning in ways that work for their age level. What sounds like chaos from our younger ages are hands on activities interspaced with conversations. The teens get some formal instruction followed by discussion and activities to enforce the topics. In all of these programs, you will find information being sent home to the ultimate educators, yourselves.

In Family Formation, the entire family receives instruction at monthly meetings and the adults complete weekly instruction based on their family's schedule and children's learning styles. The adults further their faith journey when teaching the topics to their children. Our Catechists at the weekly Formation meetings notice the same thing. Children have great input and a different view on topics than what we as adults think of. They also ask questions that we might not know the answer of so we also do research to find the proper answer. The only end to our own faith formation journey is our eventual death.

Many parents and guardians don't include themselves in the category of educators, however they are their children's first teachers. As parents, we are around our children all of the time. Children watch what we do and imitate us. I see toddlers in church genuflecting and repeating the Sign of the Cross to the best of their ability. These children haven't been to Formation, yet they learned about reverence to the tabernacle. So take the time to help your young children follow along at the front of the hymnal during Mass and guide them through the actions. Before you know it, they will be saying the prayers

and doing the actions without prompting. For those already following along during mass, model mass manners by arriving to church early to say a prayer before mass starts; prompt them to participate in Mass; and, encourage them to use the restroom and bubbler before mass so they can stay in mass for longer.

Modeling the life of a Catholic to your children:

- Pray for blessings: Do a daily recap of good things and thank God for them.
- Pray for others: Talk about struggles that they see others have. You may brainstorm some solutions, but also model praying for others and for God to make His solution known.
- Mass attendance: Make attending a weekend mass a priority and receive the Body of Christ.
- ♦ Talk about the Sermon: You can do a recap with the family and talk about something that each person learned.
- Monthly Confession: We always tell the children about the spiritual lifting of confession. Clean your soul and your heart.
