- We cancelled most of our Ash Wednesday lituraies due to the ice ቶ storm. If you weren't able to come to Mass on that day, it is OK, it is not a sin, since Ash Wednesday is not a holy day of obligation.
- When there are unusual circumstances, such as bad weather or ill ÷ health, please use the gift of wisdom, regarding going to Mass. It might be the wise decision to stay home. Let us not endanger the well being of ourselves or others.
- Today our Saturday Mass times change. Our two parishes had been ÷ doing this every six months. However, with changes coming due to the strategic planning process Into the Deep, I suspect that both parishes will have new Mass times starting early July. Let us wait and see.


