WALK TO MARY: May 6 Journey 21 Miles. Be Moved Forever.

This walk has become a pilgrimage like no other in the world. We start with St. Joseph (at the National Shrine of St. Joseph at St. Norbert College in DePere, WI) and



walk to Mary (at the National Shrine of Our Lady of Good Help in Champion, WI) to get to Jesus. The annual pilgrimage has impacted lives and filled hearts with many blessings from the Holy Family. Walk to Mary registration fees: \$25 Adults, \$10 Students

St. Joseph, Edgerton parishioner, Kim Schuetz, will be making this journey and invites you to join her. Her family is offering free of charge, overnight accommodations for 2-4 more people in their home.

WWJD: Have you ever wondered, *"What Would Jesus Do?"* You see someone in distress. *What would Jesus do?* You see an elderly person struggling to carry a heavy or awkward bag? *What would Jesus do?* It is rainy or snowy outside, and people are trying to navigate to and from their vehicles into church. *What would Jesus do?* Someone is having a

medical emergency. *What would Jesus do?*

These are just a few of the things that St. Mary Safety and Security Team are trying to address. We are offering free First Aid/CPR training at St. Mary. Get certified in general first aid and CPR for FREE. Ask yourself, *What Would Jesus Do?*

We are in desperate need of Outdoor Ushers. Duties include helping parishioners to and from their vehicles, into and out of church. Being sure that walkways are clear of snow. (Hopefully, most of that is over with for the season.) We are asking for just one day per month of your time. You will be able to attend Mass on the day that you are the Outdoor Usher. Ask yourself, *What Would Jesus Do?*

Our Safety and Security Committee is looking for ways to help others be safe, not only at church, but also in your homes and surrounding areas. Some topics we are looking into are a possible babysitting certification class for our youth, creating a safety plan for your home in case of fire, tornado, as well as safety plans while here at church. If anyone has any ideas of things that they would like us to offer or if you see anything safety concerns of our parishioners at church or at church functions, please let us know. Ask yourself, *What Would Jesus Do?*

BEREAVEMENT SERIES IN JANESVILLE: “Unfailing Love” is a monthly gathering of people struggling to understand God’s path for each of them in their lifelong journey with grief. The title is based on Psalm 33:20-22. “We wait in hope for the Lord. He is our help and our shield. In Him our hearts rejoice, for we trust in His holy name. May your unfailing love be with us Lord, even as we put our hope in you.” This is the foundation of the group, hope in the Lord and His unfailing love, as well as their unfailing love for those that have been lost. The group holds this Psalm closely while journeying through sharing, writing, prayer and looking at different aspects of their grief and how God is at work with them through

those experiences.

Unfailing Love meets on the third Monday of each month from 7:00-8:00 p.m. in the Parish Hall of Nativity of Mary in Janesville. Please enter through Wisconsin Street handicap entrance and go down the stairs. We welcome all who have lost someone, to join us in this journey of love. The next meeting is Monday, April 17.

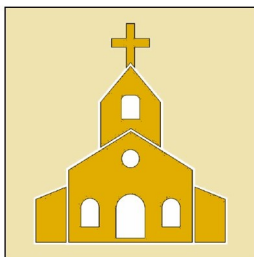

FOUR HOLY HABITS

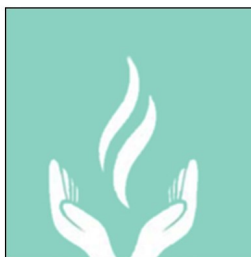
Each of us is called to be holy. Here are four habits that Bishop Hying has identified that will guide you on your path to holiness.

SUNDAY EUCHARIST



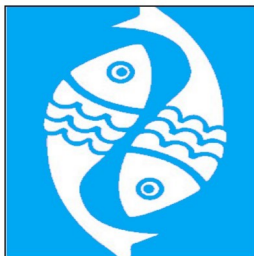
Reclaim the Sunday Eucharist as the center of parish life

PERSONAL PRAYER



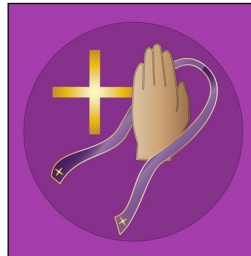
Pray and read the scriptures at least 15 minutes per day
