This walk has become a pilgrimage like no other in the world. We start with St. Joseph (at the National Shrine of St. Joseph at St. Norbert College in



# A Mote from Our Pastor ...

- Three European Catholic high school students have æ been approved as exchange students at Edgerton High School for next school year, and they expressed interest in living with Catholic host families. If anyone is interested in hosting a student, please look at their public profiles posted on the St. Joseph bulletin board or ask our office to email any of them to you.
- Those who would like to bring Communion to people who are unable 유 to come to church should know that they are required to attend a 90 -minute workshop offered by the Diocese before they can be commissioned. These classes are usually offered every 3-4 months at various churches in the Diocese (schedule is posted on the diocese website), and some are in the Janesville-Madison area, so that you wouldn't have to drive too far.
- Here is a reminder to anyone who takes Communion to someone ÷ under their care. When you visit a church away from home and approach a Communion distributor with hope of receiving a host in your pyx, please go to the priest (as opposed to a layperson who may be distributing). Please inform the priest before Mass that you will be asking him for the Communion. If you come to the priest in the Communion line, and he doesn't know you, he is required to ask you some questions, and he will probably withhold the host and ask you to see him after Mass. Please don't be hurt or feel rejected, but be grateful and know that he is following protocol. He will want to know whether you are commissioned to deliver Communion, and he will want to know that you have a metal pyx, which is the appropriate material for a container bearing the Blessed Sacrament.




Fast from meat or spend the day with some type of penance/mortification
