

This walk has become a pilgrimage




like no other in the world. We start with St. Joseph (at the National Shrine of St. Joseph at St. Norbert College in DePere, WI) and walk to Mary (at the National

**Structural Changes, Regrouping resulting from Into the Deep** Starting July 1, 2023 our two parishes (St. Mary-Milton and St. Joseph-Edgerton) will no longer be linked and sharing a priest. The new clusters or "pastorates" will be as follows:

- <u>Pastorate #14</u> will have the Catholic churches in Milton, Jefferson, Fort Atkinson, Cambridge, and Palmyra. The pastor will be Msgr. Donn Heiar, and assisting priests will be Fr. Dave Timmerman, Fr. Jorge Miramontes, and Fr. Pat Wendler
- <u>Pastorate #24</u> will have the churches in Edgerton, Oregon, Stoughton, Evansville, and Footville. The pastor will be Fr. Tom Kelley, and assisting priests will be Fr. Randy Budnar and Fr. David Wanish.

Fr. David on Into the Deep: Several people have asked why we are making structural changes. Why can't we just continue the way we have been? We are doing well right now, so why change? My answer is that we are not necessarily doing well. I have spoken at Masses about the research which shows that in many important categories, we are trending in unhealthy directions. I think we have all seen Mass attendance and faith formation enrollment decline significantly in recent years. We hope it is not too late to reverse the trajectory. The structural changes will allow more efficient use of resources and enable more attention to be directed to evangelization. Right now many priests in our diocese would love to direct more energy into evangelization, but they are unable due to time constraints. The important condition is—we must all work together. A few priests or a few helpers will not be enough to reverse the trend. It must be all of us. That is why the Bishop is emphasizing Go Make Disciples, whose goal is to help all of us to grow in evangelization. Together we can do it! Lord, help us!
