



This walk has become a pilgrimage like no other in the world. We start with St. Joseph (at the National Shrine of St. Joseph at St. Norbert



#### ST. JOSEPH SAFETY AND SECURITY:



# A Note from Our Pastor ...

- Congratulations to our students at both parishes who made their First Holy Communions this weekend! May we grow ever closer to Jesus in the sacraments of the Church.
- Preparing for the New Pastorates on July 1. We already know that our two churches, St. Mary and St. Joseph, will be in different pastorates. Sometime in June we will know the new Mass schedule at each church. It is possible that the number of Masses and the Mass times will change at each church. That could be said of both weekday and weekend Masses. Instead of seeing the same priest every weekend, you will see different priests each weekend. There will be four priests taking turns at St. Mary (Frs. Heiar, D.Timmerman, Miramontes, and Wendler) and three priests taking turns at St. Joseph (Frs. Kelley, Budnar, and Wanish). Each pastorate will have one pastor (Msgr. Heiar or Fr. Kelley), and the other priests will assist the pastor. The pastor will be the chief decision maker, and he will attend meetings of staff, pastoral council and finance council. The assisting priests will get involved with evangelization, ministry of care, faith formation, liturgy, sacramental preparation, and other tasks. The pastor will have many responsibilities, and I'm sure he will appreciate your prayers.
