Update

Increased Plot Pricing ... Why?

- Our current cost per plot is \$300. This price has been the same since 2015. The new cost for a plot will be \$600, effective August 1, 2023. Prices will be reviewed in the future and may increase as needs dictate.

The reason the Pastoral Council, along with Fr. David, decided to increase the cost of cemetery plots at St. Mary Cemetery is to always have sufficient monies in the Perpetual Care Fund to maintain the cemetery. We currently are extremely fortunate to have wonderful volunteers that mow the grounds and do general seasonal maintenance. In the future we may not have such generous volunteers. In that event those duties would need to be hired out. We must be good stewards of our resources, and the increase in plot prices will allow us to continue to add sufficient money to the Perpetual Care Fund.

Capital Improvements - Capital improvements would be items such as new blacktop or adding additional roads in the cemetery as our cemetery grows, taking down dead or diseased trees, etc.

Perpetual Care Fund - In simple terms, perpetual care involves a fund created specifically to maintain cemetery grounds, mausoleums, crypts and any other aspects of a cemetery. When families choose to have their loved ones buried at a specific cemetery, a percentage (50%) of the sale price goes toward the perpetual fund.

• Green Burial ... What is it: Green Burial Cemetery Characteristics

- * Foregoes toxic embalming
- * Does away with vaults
- * Chooses biodegradable containers, caskets, shrouds and urns
- * Encourages sustainable management practices

Why add it: Green burial gives parishioners an additional option when planning their end-of-life arrangements. There is an increased concern for environmental issues, and green burial provides an environmentally friendly option. Because there is no embalming, expensive casket or vault, green burials are often significantly less expensive (*through a funeral home*) than current burial models.

Green burial is legal and sanctioned by Statute under WI laws and is also approved by the Diocese of Madison.

We are at the point of adding new plots to our cemetery. As we do this, we plan to designate a portion of the new plots for green burial. Cost for green plots will be the same as traditional plots.

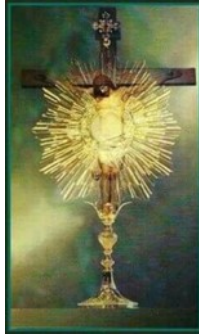
THE FEAST OF CORPUS CHRISTI

JUNE 11, 2023

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, historically known by its Latin name, Corpus Christi, celebrates the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist—Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. This feast originated with a visionary nun, St. Juliana of Mont Cornillon and a Eucharistic Miracle involving a German priest, Fr. Peter of Prague in the mid thirteenth century. The feast was extended to the whole Church by Pope Urban IV in 1264 and is celebrated in the United States on the Sunday following the Trinity Sunday.

This feast calls us to focus on two manifestations of the Body of Christ, the Holy Eucharist and the Church. The primary purpose of this feast is to focus our attention on the Eucharist. At every Mass our attention is called to the Eucharist and the Real Presence of Christ in it.

The secondary focus of this feast is upon the Body of Christ as it is present in the Church. The Church is called the Body of Christ because of the intimate communion which Jesus shares with his disciples. He expresses this in the New Testament by using the metaphor of a body in which He is the head. This image helps keep in focus both the unity and the diversity of the Church.



The Feast of Corpus Christi is commonly used as an opportunity for public Eucharistic processions, which serves as a sign of common faith and adoration. Our worship of Jesus in His Body and Blood calls us to offer to God our Father a pledge of undivided love and an offering of ourselves to the service of others.

A note regarding Holy Hour of Eucharistic Adoration: Pope Urban IV, inspired by the miracle, commissioned a Dominican friar, St. Thomas Aquinas, to compose the Mass and Office for the feast of Corpus Christi. Aquinas' hymns in honor of the Holy Eucharist, Pange Lingua, Tantum Ergo, Panis Angelicus, and O Salutaris Hostia are the beloved hymns the Church sings on the feast of Corpus Christi as well as throughout the year during Exposition and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

- Wreaths on hooks or poles

The event begins at 3:00 p.m. with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament at Nativity of Mary Church, 313 E. Wall Street. Participants will slowly walk the less-than-a-mile path to St. Patrick Church, 315 Cherry Street.



While walking, we will sing and pray the Rosary. The procession ends with Benediction at St. Patrick. 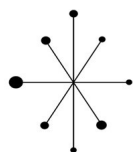

Fr. David on *Into the Deep* The model we are using in the Madison Diocese, grouping churches into pastorates served by a team of priests, has been used in other dioceses in the US. Among them is the Archdiocese of Cincinnati, who underwent these changes two years ago. The model was developed by the church consultant PartnersEdge, who has helped our diocese. Our diocese is learning much from Cincinnati and other dioceses as we continue the process and approach the July 1 transition. There are several subcommittees forming guidelines for parish activities in the new pastorates, including subcommittees for each of the following topics: administration/finance/human resources, worship and sacraments, mission, facilities and buildings, and Catholic schools. The Bishop has emphasized that *Into the Deep* (our diocesan restructuring) and *Go Make Disciples* (our diocesan plan for evangelizing) go together. If we only did one of them without the other, the results would be weaker than doing them together. *Go Make Disciples* came first, starting 3 years ago. As it proceeded the Bishop and others recognized the need for restructuring. There are frequent updates on *Into the Deep* in the Catholic Herald newspaper.

PERSONAL PRAYER



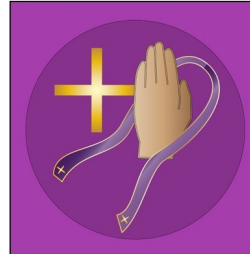
Pray and read the scriptures at least 15 minutes per day
