Catholic Mutual Group is giving a Parish Safety and Security presentation, at St. Francis Xavier Parish in Cross Plains, on May 10, at 2:00 p.m. Primary presentation will be from Larry Kappel from Catholic Mutual Group. Larry travels around the country giving church/school security presentations to increase awareness of active shooters and violent intruders afflicting our communities. He wrote in the Catholic Mutual Group Parish Safety & Security Guide "Our world has dramatically changed and nowadays, tragic acts of violence have become all too familiar." Although rare, our churches, schools and religious institutions of every size are vulnerable to violent attacks. That said, it should be our core mission to provide a safe refuge for those who wish to worship. Religious leadership has an obligation to recognize the need for safety and security at our parishes no matter how large or small. Understanding and implementing proper procedures such as awareness and preparedness is critical in your efforts to help minimize the risk of a violent attack or other emergencies." Who should come? Pastoral Council Member: What exactly is the Pastoral Council? In a nutshell, the Pastoral Council assists and consults with Father David about decisions regarding parish life. It is a great way to learn more about our parish and become an active participant in its formation. By working with Father David, they will develop an ongoing plan for the parish, as well as foster communication, cooperation, consideration and coordination throughout the parish as a whole. The Pastoral Council meets on the first Tuesday of every month at 7:00 p.m. and the meeting usually lasts about an hour.

Secretary Trustee: The Secretary Trustee serves on behalf of the parishioners, as an advisor and counselor to the Pastor and consultative bodies of the parish. Serves as a member of the parish-corporate board. Responsible to ensure that the parish maintains accurate and detailed non-financial parish corporation records.

Seeking Candidates: Do you know someone in the parish who would be a great fit for either of these positions? Or if this sounds like something you, yes you, would like to be involved in, don't hesitate to nominate yourself. Lastly, if you're on the fence about getting involved, trust in the Lord and take a leap of faith.

PERSONAL PRAYER



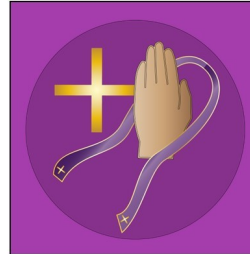
Pray and read the scriptures at least 15 minutes per day
