





ST. MICHAEL PARISH IN NIGERIA:

From Msgr. Kevin Akagha and St. Michael Parish in Nigeria, sister parish to St. Joseph-Edgerton:

Before I conclude this letter, I would like to thank you and your parishioners for all the assistance you have been giving us. All the monies

you send reach us safely. The latest was the \$2,480 you sent in February. We acknowledge receipt of this money with immense thanks and gratitude. These monies are used primarily for the maintenance of the church building, the rectory and other structures in the parish compound. Since last year, we have been fighting erosion that is trying to cut the church off from the rectory and even threatening the foundation of the rectory. The church building is on a higher ground than the rectory. When it rains the water runs down from the church grounds to the rectory area. My priestly Golden Jubilee was in December last year. As part of our preparation for that celebration, the church building was painted in and out. Part of the money sent went into these vou us maintenance projects.

ST. IOSEPH FAMILY **FAITH** FORMATION: This past year, 5 families opted for the new Family Faith Formation program at Joseph. Instead of a weekly child only meeting, Family Faith Formation is a monthly class where both parents and children attend. A typical class for this group includes a group prayer and breakout sessions for the parents and the children, fellowship, and group discussion.

The children would either discuss an activity in their workbooks or do something else related to current church happenings. Parents would sometimes view a short video or have discussions or talk about an upcoming activity/topic in the kid's workbook. The rest of the month. responsible parents are for completing activities and discussions from the workbooks as directed by the Family Faith Formation group leader for their individual family.

Some benefits of FFF included a more flexible schedule for faith learning, beneficial adult discussions about faith topics and parenting, multi -age children gathering together to learn from each other about Christ, a chance to get to know other families in our parish/group, and a tighter formed fellowship amongst group members.

- Today and next week we will share our bulletin with St. Pius X Parish in Cambridge. I hope members of all three parishes benefit from the information shared.
- Even though our Eucharistic procession at St. Joseph was done indoors due to rain, it went very well. Thank you, all servers, musicians, Knights of Columbus, and staff who helped! Today, June 18, we have switched Mass times at SM and SJ, so that we can have an outdoor procession at SM. We will go to the Gathering Green, pray a short prayer, and return. Let us focus on the Eucharist and not get distracted by cars and pedestrians; however, let us be open to answering any of their questions. Please carry your missalettes for songs and for the text on the inside back cover. We learned last weekend that it adds 30 minutes to the Mass.

- For the past year I have been serving on the advisory committee for the Madison-Jacmel (Haiti) Sister Diocese Relationship. CONFESSION



Receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation monthly
