FUNERAL LUNCHESES AT ST. MARY: COVID changed what was “normal” in our world and one of those changes was how we handle funeral lunches at St. Mary. Just prior to the pandemic our funeral lunch teams began to have difficulties getting volunteers to commit to bringing in a dish to pass - with very few using a landline and the parish not having up-to-date phone numbers, those who do not answer cell phones because of unrecognized numbers, or not returning the call to the Team leader after a message was left. Then during the pandemic, to avoid potential exposure the loved ones family were required to cater food. We have decided to continue with the catered food practice. Below is the new “normal” funeral lunch policy:

- For funeral lunches, St. Mary will provide the meeting space for a luncheon, but the loved ones family will need to cater the food. For those families unable to afford catering, they can bring their own prepared food.
- St. Mary will continue to provide beverages (lemonade, coffee, water) and table service (plates, eating utensils, cups).
- St. Mary will provide volunteers to set out the food and individual placemats, and then clean up at the end of the luncheon.

We hope you can understand how this came about and why we need to move

in this direction for the future. Thank you to all of our funeral lunch team leaders and their volunteers who donate their time to assist with this meaningful ministry.

Update

Increased Plot Pricing ... Why?

- Our current cost per plot is \$300. This price has been the same since 2015. The new cost for a plot will be \$600, effective August 1, 2023. Prices will be reviewed in the future and may increase as needs dictate.

The reason the Pastoral Council, along with Fr. David, decided to increase the cost of cemetery plots at St. Mary Cemetery is to always have sufficient monies in the Perpetual Care Fund to maintain the cemetery. We currently are extremely fortunate to have wonderful volunteers that mow the grounds and do general seasonal maintenance. In the future we may not have such generous volunteers. In that event those duties would need to be hired out. We must be good stewards of our resources, and the increase in plot prices will allow us to continue to add sufficient money to the Perpetual Care Fund.

Capital Improvements - Capital improvements would be items such as new blacktop or adding additional roads in the cemetery as our cemetery grows, taking down dead or diseased trees, etc.

Perpetual Care Fund - In simple terms, perpetual care involves a fund created specifically to maintain cemetery grounds, mausoleums, crypts and any other aspects of a cemetery. When families choose to have their loved ones buried at a specific cemetery, a percentage (50%) of the sale price goes toward the perpetual fund.

- **Green Burial ... What is it: Green Burial Cemetery Characteristics**
 - * Foregoes toxic embalming
 - * Does away with vaults
 - * Chooses biodegradable containers, caskets, shrouds and urns
 - * Encourages sustainable management practices

Why add it: Green burial gives parishioners an additional option when planning their end-of-life arrangements. There is an increased concern for environmental issues, and green burial provides an environmentally friendly option. Because there is no embalming, expensive casket or vault, green burials are often significantly less expensive (*through a funeral home*) than current burial models.

Green burial is legal and sanctioned by Statute under WI laws and is also approved by the Diocese of Madison.

We are at the point of adding new plots to our cemetery. As we do this, we plan to designate a portion of the new plots for green burial. Cost for green plots will be the same as traditional plots.

EUCCHARISTIC PROCESSION AT ST. JOSEPH! You are invited Sunday, June 11 after 10:30 a.m. Mass for our very first Eucharistic Procession. We will begin at the end of Mass with



Exposition and then walk around St. Joseph Circle following Fr. David prominently holding the Blessed Sacrament. We will return to church and conclude with Benediction.

The procession will be a holy, praise-filled, and inspiring event with adoration, praying and singing. Please join us for this extraordinary occasion!

(In case of inclement weather, we will process around the church halls)

We will have the inside of the circle beautifully decorated to enhance the procession. Therefore, we are asking that you ***DO NOT PARK ALONG THE INNER CURB OF ST. JOSEPH CIRCLE on Sunday, June 11.***

And with that, we invite all parishioners to bring pots of flowers or other appropriate garden or religious decor from your home and place it on the inside curb before Mass on June 11th (which you will take home after the procession). Items may include:

- Large Flowerpots with Flowers (real or artificial)
- Garden Flags

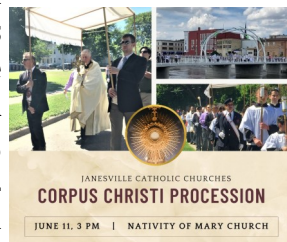
- Decorative Garden Stakes

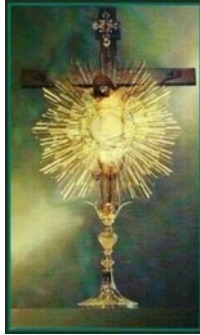
THE FEAST OF CORPUS CHRISTI

JUNE 11, 2023

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, historically known by its Latin name, Corpus Christi, celebrates the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist—Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. This feast originated with a visionary nun, St. Juliana of Mont Cornillon and a Eucharistic Miracle involving a German priest, Fr. Peter of Prague in the mid thirteenth century. The feast was extended to the whole Church by Pope Urban IV in 1264 and is celebrated in the United States on the Sunday following the Trinity Sunday.

This feast calls us to focus on two manifestations of the Body of Christ, the Holy Eucharist and the Church. The primary purpose of this feast is to focus our attention on the Eucharist. At every Mass our attention is called to the Eucharist and the Real Presence of Christ in it.

The secondary focus of this feast is upon the Body of Christ as it is present in the Church. The Church is called the Body of Christ because of the intimate communion which Jesus shares with his disciples. He expresses this in the New Testament by using the metaphor of a body in which He is the head. This image helps keep in focus both the unity and the diversity of the Church.



The Feast of Corpus Christi is commonly used as an opportunity for public Eucharistic processions, which serves as a sign of common faith and adoration. Our worship of Jesus in His Body and Blood calls us to offer to God our Father a pledge of undivided love and an offering of ourselves to the service of others.

A note regarding Holy Hour of Eucharistic Adoration: Pope Urban IV, inspired by the miracle, commissioned a Dominican friar, St. Thomas Aquinas, to compose the Mass and Office for the feast of Corpus Christi. Aquinas' hymns in honor of the Holy Eucharist, Pange Lingua, Tantum Ergo, Panis Angelicus, and O Salutaris Hostia are the beloved hymns the Church sings on the feast of Corpus Christi as well as throughout the year during Exposition and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

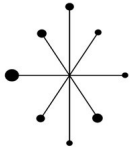

ST. JOSEPH FAMILY FAITH FORMATION

This past year, 5 families opted for the new Family Faith Formation program at St. Joseph. Instead of a weekly child only meetings, Family Faith Formation is a monthly class where both parents and children attend. A typical class for this group included a group prayer and break out sessions for the parents and the children, fellowship and group discussion.

The children would either discuss an activity in their workbooks or do something else related to current church happenings. Parents would sometimes view a short video or PowerPoint, have discussions or talk about an upcoming activity/ topic in the kids workbook.

The rest of the month, parents were responsible for completing activities and discussions from the workbooks as directed by the Family Faith Formation group leader for their individual family.

Some benefits of FFF included a more flexible schedule for faith learning, beneficial adult discussions about faith topics and parenting, multi-age children gathering together to learn from each other about Christ, a chance to get to know other families in our parish/group, and a tighter formed fellowship amongst group members.

"Our family enjoyed FFF for the flexibility in our busy schedule!"



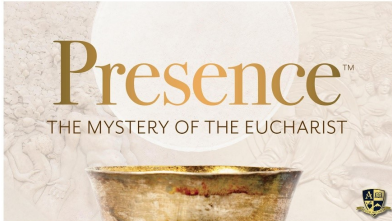

The purpose of a procession is to bear public witness to our faith that Jesus is really present in the Eucharist. You may be able to express that to a pedestrian or curious onlooker. For those interested in a thorough review of Church teaching on the Eucharist, please read the Eucharist section of the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, paragraphs #1322-1419.
- ✠ St. Joseph and St. Mary Parishes will switch Mass times on Sunday, June 18 to allow for a procession in Milton. On that day, St. Joseph meets at 8:30 and St. Mary meets at 10:30. The switch is for June 18 only.

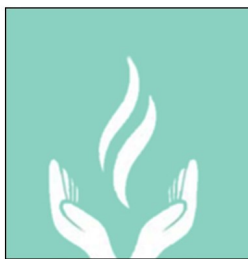

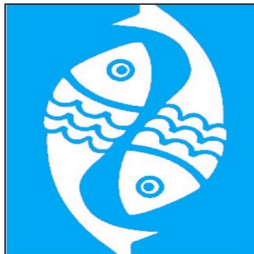
Reclaim the Sunday Eucharist as the center of parish life

PERSONAL PRAYER



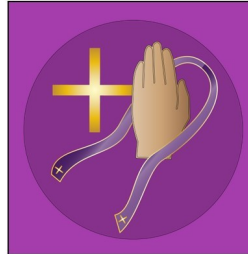
Pray and read the scriptures at least 15 minutes per day
